

I.R.S. Address

The IRS has a specific protocol when it comes to taxpayer addresses. The basic rule is that you need to have the last filed tax return's address on line 3 or 4, but if the filing address was incorrect when filed, for example, it was missing the directional term South or the street suffix (e.g., Dr, Blvd, St), the IRS will update their records to the correct complete address. They update the address in case they need to mail correspondence to the taxpayer. The IRS verifies 4506T orders against the address on file that has been reviewed and is determined to be complete and correct, which is not always identical to what is on the taxpayer's copy of the filed return. We recommend checking the USPS for the standardized address (https://tools.usps.com/go/ZipLookupAction_input). If you still cannot resolve the issue then the taxpayer can contact the IRS directly at 800-908-4490 to find out what address they have on file.
